The Johnson Academic Center offers a series of social skills classes to help children learn skills that are important in making friends and maintaining positive social interactions with peers.

Summer classes are 60-minutes long, held daily for 1-week sessions. Through discussion, role play, direct teaching, and games children discover the "hidden curriculum" of the social world.
